

- 1) Do you want to remove the board's power to recall a board member without a membership vote?

With the board's recent actions, i.e., recalling duly-elected board director Ann Ullman for "personal reasons", and changing the membership meeting and recall election quorum, the board



must be reined in by the members. The members who crowded the Mountain View Auditorium at the October board meeting are heroes.
