Craig Brown has been a leader in closing legal committee meetings. He was responsible for changing the membership meeting quorum from 100 to 1,250, even though state statute forbids a board from raising membership meeting quorums.

His response to the members circulating a petition drive was to shorten the time limit from six months to three and to not allow petition circulation on RCSC property.

It's time for a "Brown out".

It is not for the benefit of the members to have closed meetings or board members to get more money to fund their personal pet projects.

Send the message by voting for Cordell Angier, Dan Hill, Larry Klein and Carol Martinez.
