Projects should get vote

This is a call to action for the RCSC board meeting 9 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 26, at Sundial Recreation Center auditorium, 14801 N. 103rd Ave.

The RCSC Board will vote to approve budgeting \$30 million for projects that should get Membership approval first. Article X mandates a Membership vote for "indebtedness or liability, direct or contingent" of more than \$750,000. Our attorney, Nancy Mangone, sent a letter dated Sept. 12, 2013, to the RCSC statutory agent James Hienton advising him that RCSC's upcoming action is another distressing disregard of the Articles of Incorporation against the interests of the Members.

The Members are supposed to have a Membership meeting on Sept. 26, but none was called by the RCSC. The board has interfered with Membership action so that it can spend money without permission on pet projects of the

board directors. The board has created an income stream to pay for them that is not allowed because it creates unequal responsibilities of the Members.

The Members have an opportunity to attend the board meeting and protest. Be sure to sign up to speak before the meeting begins. When called to speak, go to the podium and simply say, "These projects must be approved by the Members," and "This should be a Membership meeting." Repeat the message like a drum beat. Get on the tape. Be counted. Then, sit down.

We will take their abuse and dismissal to the judge in our class action lawsuit against them. See <u>"About the RCSC Lawsuit"</u> on <u>annereport.com</u>.

The Articles of Incorporation say that in a dispute with the board, "the action of the Members shall prevail."
