## Motions for membership meeting – try, try again

Call to action to attend in person and vote at the Recreation Centers of Sun City Quarterly Membership meeting 9 a.m. Thursday, Nov. 19 Sundial Auditorium, Boswell & 103rd Ave. Prepare to stay for three hours. Delaying tactics intend to get people to leave before voting. Don't fall for it. Noel Kasper will try again to make motions from the floor to circulate petitions that call for a ballot vote to amend the RCSC Articles of Incorporation.

The issues will be:

1) Do you want to remove the board's power to recall a board member without a membership vote?

2) Do you want to remove the board's power to write bylaws and board policies without a membership vote?

With the board's recent actions, i.e., recalling duly-elected board director Ann Ullman for "personal reasons", and changing the membership meeting and recall election quorum, the board must be reined in by the members. The members who crowded the Mountain View Auditorium at the October board meeting are heroes. They delayed the board's motion to increase the quorum for membership meetings and recall elections to 3500 from 100, which effectively would have ended both, making the members "deep-pocket slaves". However, it's not over. They want the homeowners and dissenting board members out of their way.

The history of the RCSC board oligarchy committing millions of dollars they did not have in hand for projects that the members did not vote for is chronicled on <u>http://www.annereport.com</u>.

Rein in the board's power. Require a membership vote to change the bylaws and board policies or to recall directors.

RCSC election recommendations: Vote only on Dec. 8. Leave incumbent Bishop blank.
